7-312. SAME -- OFFICERS.

(A) IN GENERAL.

FROM AMONG ITS MEMBERS, EACH BOARD SHALL ELECT A CHAIRMAN AND OTHER OFFICERS THAT THE BOARD CONSIDERS NECESSARY.

(B) ELECTIONS AND TERMS OF OFFICE.

THE MANNER OF ELECTION OF OFFICERS AND THEIR TERMS OF OFFICE SHALL BE AS THE BOARD DETERMINES.

7-313. SAME -- MEETINGS; COMPENSATION.

(A) MEETINGS.

EACH BOARD SHALL MEET AT LEAST 4 TIMES A YEAR, AT THE TIMES AND PLACES THAT IT DETERMINES.

(B) COMPENSATION.

A MEMBER OF A BOARD MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION.
