to receive service credit for the same period under any other provision of this article, or who is not receiving retirement benefits from any political subdivision or municipal corporation of this State, shall be entitled in the year in which he retires to credit for previous service rendered by him to the municipal corporation upon the payment by him or the municipal corporation or a combination of both of an amount equal to the reserves required to fund the previous service.]

- (12) IN THE YEAR THAT A MEMBER RETIRES, THE MEMBER IS ENTITLED TO CREDIT FOR ANY PREVIOUS SERVICE RENDERED BY THE MEMBER AS A FULL-TIME PAID EMPLOYEE OF A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THIS STATE IF:
- (A) THE EMPLOYEE IS NOT ENTITLED TO RECEIVE SERVICE CREDIT FOR THE SAME PERIOD UNDER ANY OTHER PROVISION OF THIS ARTICLE;
- (B) THE EMPLOYEE IS NOT RECEIVING RETIREMENT BENEFITS FROM ANY POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OR MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THIS STATE; AND
- (C) THE EMPLOYEE, THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION, OR BOTH, PAY AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO THE RESERVES REQUIRED TO FUND THE PREVIOUS SERVICE.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1982.
