Public--Works7--for-the-following-public-purposes7-including any-applicable-architects'-and-engineers'-fees:-to-fund--the cost---of--planning--the--feasibility--of--constructing--and actually-planning-the-construction-of-a-scenic--railroad--in Garrett--County--from--Oakland--to-Swallow-Falls-State-Park7 including-the-use-of-the-Oakland-railroad-depot-owned-by-the Chessic-Railroad-Company--and-the-use-of-a-main-line-of--the Chessic--Railroad--Company--to--a--point--where--the--scenic railroad-will-be-switched-off-to-a--state-operated--railroad line7---which--would-traverse-all-state-owned-property-to-the Swallow-Falls-State-Park.

(4)--There-is-hereby-levied-and-imposed-an-annual-State tax-on-all-assessable-property-in--the--State--in--rate--and amount--sufficient--to--pay-the-principal-of-and-interest-on the-bonds-as-and-when-due--and--until--paid--in--full;--such principal--to-be-discharged-within-fifteen-years-of-the-date of-issue-of-the-bonds-

The Department of State Planning shall study the planning and feasibility of constructing a scenic railroad in Garrett County from Herrington Manor State Park to Swallow Falls State Park, which would traverse all state-owned property to the Swallow Falls State Park. The Departments shall complete its study and report its findings to the House Appropriations and Senate Budget and Taxation Committees of the General Assembly by November 1, 1982.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June July 1, 1982.

## CHAPTER 675

(House Bill 1006)

AN ACT concerning

Creation of a State Debt - <u>Havre De Grace</u> Shore Erosion Control

FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of \$50,000, the proceeds to be used as a grant to the City of Havre de Grace for shore erosion control subject to the requirement that the City of Havre de Grace provide at least an equal and matching fund of a certain type for the same purpose by a certain date; and providing generally for the issue and sale of bonds evidencing the loan.
