- [(5)] (7) To recognize the right of those mentally retarded individuals for whom care in a residential facility is necessary to live in surroundings as nearly normal as possible and to provide adequate facilities for this purpose;
- [(6)] (8) To provide appropriate social and protective services for those mentally retarded individuals who are unable to manage themselves and their affairs with ordinary prudence;
- [(7)] (9) To protect the rights of parents and to help parents and guardians in planning for and managing mentally retarded individuals;
- [(8)] (10) To promote and provide for the development, maintenance, and coordination of all programs for mentally retarded individuals;
- [(9)] (11) To advance research and professional training related to mental retardation; and

- (a) In addition to the powers and duties set forth elsewhere in this title, the Director has the powers, duties, and responsibilities set forth in this section.
 - (b) The Director is responsible for-
