8-316. POWERS AND DUTIES.

(A) POWERS.

EACH COUNTY ADVISORY COUNCIL AND EACH INTERCOUNTY ADVISORY COUNCIL MAY:

- (1) CREATE COMMITTEES; AND
- (2) HAVE ADDITIONAL INDIVIDUALS PARTICIPATE AS NEEDED.

(B) DUTIES.

EACH COUNTY ADVISORY COUNCIL AND INTERCOUNTY ADVISORY COUNCIL SHALL:

- (1) WITH THE ADVICE AND HELP OF THE ALCOHOLISM COORDINATOR FOR THE APPROPRIATE COUNTY:

- (I) REVIEW PERIODICALLY THE AVAILABLE SERVICES AND FACILITIES; AND

- (II) DETERMINE THE NEEDS OF THE COUNTY ALCOHOLISM PROGRAM;

- (2) HELP THE ALCOHOLISM COORDINATOR IN REVISING ANNUALLY THE COUNTY ALCOHOLISM PLAN;

- (3) ADVISE THE HEALTH OFFICER FOR AND GOVERNING BODY OF THE APPROPRIATE COUNTY AND, THROUGH THE ALCOHOLISM COORDINATOR, THE DIRECTOR ON:

- (I) THE PROGRESS OF THE COUNTY ALCOHOLISM CONTROL PROGRAM; AND

- (II) ANY ACTION NEEDED TO IMPROVE THE PROGRAM;
