substantial and immediate danger and harm to the licensee or others if the license is continued pending a hearing, before it suspends or revokes a license under this section, the Administration immediately shall give written notice to the applicant or licensee, and the applicant or licensee may request a hearing as provided in Title 12, Subtitle 2 of this article.

- (2) If the Administration determines that there is a likelihood of substantial and immediate danger and harm to the licensee or others if the license is continued pending a hearing, the Administration:
 - (i) Immediately may suspend the license;
- (ii) Within 7 days of a request for a hearing, shall grant the licensee a hearing as provided in Title 12, Subtitle 2 of this article; and
- (iii) After the hearing, render an immediate decision as to whether or not it should continue the suspension or revoke the license.
- [(c)] (D) If a hearing is not requested, the Administration shall continue, modify, or extend the suspension of the license or revoke the license.

Article 27 - Crimes and Punishments

[Minors - Obtaining Liquor]

[400.

Any person under the age of twenty-one years, except where beer or light wine is involved, any person under the age of eighteen years, who knowingly and wilfully makes any misrepresentation or false statement as to his age, and by reason of such misrepresentation or false statement obtains any spirituous or fermented liquors from any other person licensed to sell spirituous or fermented liquors under the laws of this State, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not less than one dollar nor more than twenty dollars, or imprisoned in jail for not less than five days nor more than thirty days, or be both fined and imprisoned in the discretion of the court; provided, that the testimony given by any minor or person under twenty-one years of age in the prosecution of any person for selling liquor to minors under the laws of this State shall not be used against such minor in prosecution under this section.
