- (A) A copy of any order shall be served upon all parties to the proceedings, and the appropriate law enforcement agency.
- (B) The judge who issues the order: may-direct immediate-service-AND-MAY-REISSUE-THE-ORDER-UNTIL-SERVICE-IS COMPLETE:
- (C)--RETURN-OF-SERVICE-SHALL-BE-FILED-WITH-THE-COURT-BY THE-APPROPRIATE-LAW-ENFORCEMENT-AGENCY-

(1) MAY:

- (I) DIRECT IMMEDIATE SERVICE; AND
- (II) REISSUE THE ORDER UNTIL SERVICE IS EFFECTED; BUT
- FROM THE DATE OF THE INITIAL APPEARANCE OF THE PETITIONER.
 - (C) RETURN OF SERVICE SHALL BE FILED WITH THE COURT.

CHAPTER 906

(House Bill 1874)

AN ACT concerning

Clerks of Court - Fees

FOR the purpose of altering the amount of certain fees collected by clerks of the court; providing that clerks shall retain a certain commission on certain fines and forfeitures; providing for a certain disbursement of fees collected by the clerk for performing a marriage ceremony; repealing certain special provisions relating to certain clerks' fees collected in certain counties; providing for the disbursement of certain fees charged for obtaining a marriage license; providing for a certain minimum fee for recording certain deeds and instruments; clarifying language; and generally relating to fees collected by clerks of courts.
