State Procurement Law - Reporting Requirements

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That section(s) of the Annotated Code of Maryland read(s) as follows:

Article 21 - Procurement

3-206.

Procurements of not more than \$7,500 may be made under small procurement procedures adopted by a department. The procedures established by the department shall provide for a simplified administrative process which is consistent with the basic intent of this article and which is not economically disadvantageous to this State. Procurements may not be artificially divided so as to constitute a small procurement under this section. At least every 3 years, the [Governor] BOARD shall review the prevailing costs of labor and materials and, IF WARRANTED, recommend to the legislature based on appropriate changes in prevailing costs of labor and materials appropriate adjustments in the ceiling of small procurements.
