oysters by means of self-contained underwater breathing apparatus diving or other diving techniques; (2) the probable effects of these diving techniques on the supply of seed oysters; and (3) whether these diving techniques to harvest oysters could completely deplete the supply of oysters for the tonging and dredging industries; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the committee be composed of 3 members of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates; 3 members of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President of the Senate; and 3 6 representatives of—the—Department—of—Natural-Resources; appointed by the Secretary of Natural Resources; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Secretary of Natural Resources designate the chairman of the committee; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the committee report its findings and recommendations to the Legislative Policy Committee of the General Assembly and the Governor by December 1, 1982; and be it further
