A House Joint Resolution concerning

Penetrating Bullets

FOR the purpose of urging Congress to introduce and pass legislation defining and banning the manufacture, sale, use, possession, and importation of bullets, the sole purpose of which is to defeat the protection offered to law enforcement officers wearing bulletproof vests.

WHEREAS, Law enforcement is essential to the exercise of our rights and liberties in an environment that is safe from crime; and
