(E) RECIPIENT OF SERVICES.

(1) "RECIPIENT OF SERVICES" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL WHO RECEIVES CARE, MAINTENANCE, TREATMENT, OR SUPPORT IN A FACILITY OR PROGRAM THAT IS OPERATED OR FUNDED WHOLLY OR PARTLY BY THE DEPARTMENT.

(2) "RECIPIENT OF SERVICES" INCLUDES:

(I) AN INDIVIDUAL IN A PUBLIC FACILITY UNDER THE MARYLAND MENTAL HYGIENE LAW;

(II) AN INDIVIDUAL IN A FACILITY OR VETERANS' ADMINISTRATION HOSPITAL FOR COMPREHENSIVE EVALUATION UNDER THE MARYLAND MENTAL RETARDATION LAW;

(III) AN INDIVIDUAL IN A RESIDENTIAL, PUBLIC FACILITY OR A FACILITY FROM WHICH THIS STATE OBTAINS RESIDENTIAL CARE UNDER THE MARYLAND MENTAL RETARDATION LAW; AND

(IV) AN INDIVIDUAL TO WHOM JUVENILE SCREENING OR TREATMENT SERVICES ARE PROVIDED UNDER § 6-117(B)(1)(II) OF THIS ARTICLE.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This subsection is new language added to provide a single, clear term that can be used to refer to all individuals to whom this title applies.

Paragraph (1) of this subsection is derived without substantive change from the second clause of the second sentence of former Article 43, § 601(b)(1).

Paragraph (2)(ii) of this subsection is added to reflect the exception in the second sentence of former Article 59A, § 3(b).
