The former specific reference to compliance with the "standards or qualifications" is deleted as unnecessary since they are set by rule or regulation under §§ 17-202 and 17-203 of this subtitle.

17-212. PROFICIENCY TEST FOR EXEMPTED PHYSICIANS.

(A) PROFICIENCY REQUIRED.

A PHYSICIAN WHO IS EXEMPTED FROM THE PERMIT REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SUBTITLE SHALL DEMONSTRATE SATISFACTORY PERFORMANCE IN A PROFICIENCY TESTING PROGRAM IN APPLICABLE LABORATORY PROCEDURES BEFORE THE PHYSICIAN PERFORMS ANY MEDICAL LABORATORY PROCEDURE.

(B) PROFICIENCY TEST.

- (1) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ESTABLISH THE STANDARDS FOR DEMONSTRATING SATISFACTORY PERFORMANCE IN THE PROFICIENCY TESTING PROGRAM.
- (2) THE DEPARTMENT OR AN ORGANIZATION APPROVED BY THE SECRETARY SHALL CONDUCT THE PROFICIENCY TESTING PROGRAM.

(C) FEE.

A PHYSICIAN SHALL PAY TO THE DEPARTMENT THE TEST FEE SET BY THE SECRETARY.

(D) FAILURE BY PHYSICIAN.

IF A PHYSICIAN FAILS TO DEMONSTRATE SATISFACTORY PERFORMANCE IN A PROFICIENCY TESTING PROGRAM, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL NOTIFY THE COMMISSION ON MEDICAL DISCIPLINE OF MARYLAND.
