Dear Mr. President:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 1045.

This bill clarifies and provides in the law the procedures followed in computing and paying the contributions payable by "municipal corporations" participating in the State Retirement/Pension Systems.

House Bill 1883, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on June 1, 1982 accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 1045.

AN ACT concerning

Pensions - Municipal Corporation Contributions

FOR the purpose of clarifying the basis for computing and paying the contributions of each participating municipal corporation to the Employees' Retirement System of the State and the Pension System for employees of the State; providing for normal contributions and rates and certain adjustments along with accrued liability contributions; providing for the
