Dear Mr. President:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 1050.

This bill authorizes the creation of a State Debt to be used to finance the construction or renovation of certain public school buildings and facilities by the County Boards of Education.

House Bill 1824, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on June 1, 1982, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 1050.
