The Federal Extended Benefits Triggering Formula

FOR the purpose of urging Congress to revise the Insured Unemployment Rate formula for triggering federal extended benefits under the unemployment insurance program so that individuals receiving extended benefits are calculated into the category of individuals receiving benefits under the formula; and urging Congress to revise the Insured Unemployment Rate mechanism for triggering federal extended benefits so that the Insured Unemployment Rates currently used to trigger extended benefits are not raised as scheduled on September 26, 1982.
