Dear Mr. Speaker:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed House Bill 545.

This bill provides that a relative, who is aware that another person is a lawful custodian of a child, may not abduct, take, or carry away a child under 12 years of age from the lawful custodian to a place outside of this State.
