AN ACT concerning

Creation of a State Debt - Space Telescope Science Institute

FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of \$2,000,000, the proceeds to be used to assist the Johns Hopkins University in the construction of the Space Telescope Science Institute in Baltimore City; and providing generally for the issue and sale of bonds evidencing the loan.

The Speaker put the question: Shall the Bill pass, notwithstanding the objections of the Executive?
