This bill, as introduced, intended to limit the exemptions from the provisions of the High-Voltage Line Act by requiring that certain contractors working on high voltage lines be experienced and have a reputation for expertise in this particular type of work. However, the bill was amended to add additional exemptions to the High-Voltage Line Act which, in my view, will increase the risk of accidental injury or death to Maryland workers from electrocution because certain safety precautions required by the High-Voltage Line Act might not be taken.

For these reasons, and with the agreement of the sponsor, I have decided to veto Senate Bill 150.
