In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed House Bill 942.

This bill alters the salaries of the judges of the Orphans' Court for Baltimore County and establishes that these salary alterations does not affect the incumbent judges.

Senate Bill 464, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on June 1, 1982, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign House Bill 942.
