AN ACT concerning

Mental Hygiene - Procedures and Hearing for Admission

FOR the purpose of providing for procedures relating to the admission or release of an individual to a facility operated by the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene; providing for a hearing under certain circumstances; providing that the hearing be conducted within a certain time in a certain manner; providing that the hearing officer consider certain elements as to the individual whose admission is sought; clarifying language; and generally relating to circumstances and procedures regarding admission to certain facilities.
