FOR the purpose of providing that evidence of a certain chemical analysis is not admissible in a certain prosecution under certain circumstances; providing that the admissibility of evidence of a certain chemical analysis is not precluded or limited by a certain provision under certain circumstances; clarifying language; and generally relating to a chemical test for alcohol.
