In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 254.

This bill eliminates special unemployment insurance contribution rates for employers in an urban enterprise zone.

Senate Bill 811, which comprehensively structured the urban enterprise zone program in Maryland, was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 20, 1982, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 254.
