In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 264.

This bill provides that the minimum State pension for beneficiaries of the Employees and Teachers Retirement System who retired prior to 1958 with 30 years of service shall be increased.

House Bill 481, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on June 1, 1982, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 264.
