

Creation of a State Debt - Lyric Theater

FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of ~~\$2,000,000~~ \$1,000,000, the proceeds to be used as a grant to the Lyric Foundation, Inc. to assist the Lyric Foundation, Inc. in the continuation of the modernization of the Lyric Theater, subject to the requirement that the Lyric Foundation, Inc. provide at least an equal and matching fund of a certain kind for the same purpose by a certain date; and providing generally for the issue and sale of bonds evidencing the loan.

The President put the question: Shall the Bill pass, notwithstanding the objections of the Executive

Dear Mr. President:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 378.

This bill requires the county governing body to meet and confer with municipal officials to determine if the county will levy a tax on assessable property within the municipality which is less than the general county tax rate if the municipality performs governmental services in lieu of similar county services.

House Bill 1245, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on June 1, 1982, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 378.
