

FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of ~~\$8,275,000~~ \$7,000,000, the proceeds to be used as a grant to assist in the construction or purchase and equipping equipment of the Prince George's County Detention Center Complex subject to the requirement that the County Council of Prince George's County provide at least an equal and matching fund of a certain type for the same purpose by a certain date; and providing generally for the issue and sale of bonds evidencing the loan.

The President put the question: Shall the Bill pass, notwithstanding the objections of the Executive

Dear Mr. President:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 483.

This bill allows fire departments and rescue squads of the State or any political subdivision to request a criminal records check on an applicant for employment or appointment as a paramedic, fire or rescue squad member.

House Bill 730, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on June 1, 1982, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 483.
