

FOR the purpose of allowing criminal record checks on applicants for a volunteer or paid fire fighter, rescue squad member, or paramedic position; providing that these applicants upon request provide a set of fingerprints to certain State authorities; and providing that information regarding criminal convictions may be considered when hiring these applicants; and generally relating to criminal record checks for fire fighters, rescue squad members, and paramedics.

BY adding to

Article 38A - Fires and Investigations
Section 7A
Annotated Code of Maryland
(1978 Replacement Volume and 1981 Supplement)

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 512.

This bill authorizes the creation of a State debt to be used to continue the Maryland Housing Rehabilitation Program.

House Bill 810, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on June 1, 1982, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 512.
