

If this bill were signed, neither the State nor the local jurisdiction could adopt reasonable regulations governing shooting between the very early hour of 7:00 a.m. and the very late hour of midnight, regardless of whether such hours of shooting were compatible with the comfort of those living in the residential community.

For these reasons, I have decided to veto Senate Bill 530.

Senate Bill No. 530

AN ACT concerning

Environmental Noise Standards - Shooting Sports Clubs

FOR the purpose of prohibiting a political subdivision from adopting any noise control ordinance, rule, or regulation that prohibits trapshooting, skeetshooting or other target shooting at certain times by certain shooting sports clubs; providing that certain sound level limits and noise control rules and regulations adopted under the Health - Environmental Article do not prohibit trapshooting, skeetshooting or other target shooting at certain times by certain shooting sports clubs; and providing for the repeal of inconsistent public general or public local laws.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

Article - Health - Environmental
Section 3-105 and 3-401
Annotated Code of Maryland
(As enacted by Chapter ____ (H.B./S.B. ____) of the Acts
of the General Assembly of 1982)
