Senate Bill No. 620

AN ACT concerning

State Soil Conservation Committee

FOR the purpose of altering the term of office of the committee appointed members of the district governing bodies of the State Soil Conservation Committee; and providing that each supervisor serving at the time of the effective date of this Act shall serve out a fifth year beyond the original 4 year terms.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

Article - Agriculture
Section 8-302
Annotated Code of Maryland
(1974 Volume and 1981 Supplement)

Dear Mr. President:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 624.

That bill would affect the motor vehicle fuel tax on gasohol by taxing gasohol produced in Maryland at the rate of four cents less per gallon than other motor vehicle fuels. The reduced tax would be in effect for Fiscal Years 1983 through 1985.

The Attorney General has determined in the attached letter that the discriminatory reduction of the tax on gasohol produced in Maryland violates the provisions of
