Dear Mr. President:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 643.

This bill provides that the Liquor Control Board of Harford County will no longer be a State agency, and prohibits employment of a person under 18 years of age by a licensee.

House Bill 1206, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on June 1, 1982, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 643.

AN ACT concerning

Harford County - Liquor Control Board

FOR the purpose of removing Harford County from the list of those counties in which the liquor control board is declared to be a State agency; providing for the minimum age under which a person may be employed to sell or serve alcoholic beverages in Harford County; and clarifying language.
