SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 27 - Crimes and Punishments

441.

(e) The term "crime of violence" means abduction; arson; burglary, including common-law and all statutory and storehouse forms of burglary offenses; escape; housebreaking; kidnapping; manslaughter, excepting involuntary manslaughter; mayhem; murder; rape IN-THE-FIRST-AND-SECOND-DEGREE; robbery; robbery with a DANGEROUS-OR deadly weapon; SEXUAL OFFENSE IN THE FIRST AND SECOND DEGREE; and sodomy; or an attempt to commit any of the aforesaid offenses; or assault with intent to commit any other offense punishable by imprisonment for more than one year.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1983.
