(House Joint Resolution No. 52)

A House Joint Resolution concerning

Chesapeake Bay - Maryland's Seafood Industry - Finfish

FOR the purpose of requesting the Joint Committee on Administrative, Executive and Legislative Review and the Secretary of Natural Resources to study and monitor certain laws, rules, and regulations of this State concerning the tidal finfish fisheries of the Chesapeake Bay; and setting forth a policy by the General Assembly of Maryland regarding the restoration, protection, and enhancement of finfish in the Chesapeake Bay and its tributaries.

WHEREAS, The Chesapeake Bay and its tributaries, which comprise one-fifth of Maryland, are one of the most productive estuaries in the nation and contribute materially to the well-being of all Maryland citizens; and

WHEREAS, A survey of Maryland's citizens conducted by the University of Maryland in 1980 ranked the Maryland seafood industry as the most important use of the Chesapeake Bay; and

WHEREAS, The Maryland seafood industry, with its genesis in the watermen of the Chesapeake Bay, gives rise to the image of a "Land of Pleasant Living"; and

WHEREAS, The image of the "Land of Pleasant Living" is used to attract tourists and commerce; and
