AN ACT concerning

Certain Health Boards - Continuation

FOR the purpose of continuing the State Board of Dental Examiners, the State Board of Examiners of Nurses, the State Board of Examiners of Nursing Home Administrators, the State Board of Examiners in Optometry, the State Board of Pharmacy, the State Board of Medical Examiners, the Commission on Medical Discipline, the State Board of Examiners of Psychologists, and the Health Services Cost Review Commission by extending to a certain date the termination provisions relating to the statutory and regulatory authority of these boards in order to bring these provisions into conformity with those of Chapter 519 of the Acts of 1982 (Program Evaluation Act), which altered the period of continuation for certain boards and commissions.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
