

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed House Bill 123.

This bill continues the existence of the Board of Examiners for Hearing Aid Dealers in accordance with the Regulatory Programs Evaluation Act of 1978 beyond July 1, 1984 to July 1, 1994.

Senate Bill 80, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 10, 1983, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore it is not necessary for me to sign House Bill 123.

AN ACT concerning

Board of Examiners for Hearing Aid Dealers -  
Continuation

FOR the purpose of continuing the existence of the Board of Examiners for Hearing Aid Dealers in accordance with the Program Evaluation Act (Sunset Act) by extending to a certain date the termination provisions relating to the statutory and regulatory authority of the Board.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

Article 56 - Licenses  
Section 529  
Annotated Code of Maryland  
(1979 Replacement Volume and 1982 Supplement)

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 56 - Licenses

529.

The provisions of this subtitle creating the Board of Examiners for Hearing Aid Dealers and relating to the regulation of hearing aids and any regulations promulgated under this subtitle are of no effect and may not be enforced after July 1, [1984] 1994.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1983.
