AN ACT concerning

Milk Products - Standards and Requirements

FOR the purpose of extending the scope of a milk truck tank operator permit to the handling of milk products under certain circumstances; providing an exception to the requirement for a milk truck tank operator permit; repealing a certain State standard for cream; providing that certain pasteurized milk products meet all definitions and standards of identity established by federal law or regulation; ~~clarifying--that--standards--and--labeling--requirements--for--condensed--milk--and--condensed--skimmed--milk--apply--only--to--nongraded--condensed--milk--and--nongraded--condensed--skimmed--milk~~; and generally relating to the production, processing, labeling, and distribution of milk products in this State.
