AN ACT concerning

Apprenticeship and Training Council

FOR the purpose of continuing the existence of the Apprenticeship and Training Council in accordance with the Program Evaluation Act (Sunset Law) by extending to a certain date the termination provisions of the Council.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

Article 89 - Division of Labor and Industry  
Section 50A  
Annotated Code of Maryland  
(1979 Replacement Volume and 1982 Supplement)
