AN ACT concerning

State Board of Law Examiners

FOR the purpose of continuing the existence of the State Board of Law Examiners in accordance with the Program Evaluation Act (Sunset Law) by extending to a certain date the termination provisions for the Board.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

Article 10 - Attorneys at Law and Attorneys in Fact
Section 8A
Annotated Code of Maryland
(1981 Replacement Volume and 1982 Supplement)

MESSAGE FROM THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE

Dear Mr. Speaker:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed House Bill 314.

This bill provides that the Maryland Natural Resources Police and its Virginia counterparts can continuously pursue persons who have violated State law into the other state's waters and make an arrest.

Senate Bill 296, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 31, 1983, accomplishes the same purpose.
