AN ACT concerning

Maryland State Board of Public Accountancy -  
Consumer Members

FOR the purpose of adding consumer members to the Maryland State Board of Public Accountancy; providing for the initial terms of the consumer members and the staggering of their terms of office; providing for the reappointment of the initial consumer members; making stylistic changes; and generally relating to the Maryland State Board of Public Accountancy.

BY repealing
