Since the provisions of Senate Bill 280 differ from Chapter 199, I have decided to veto Senate Bill 280.

AN ACT concerning

Prevailing Wage - Contracts for Public Works -
Appointment of Chairman

FOR the purpose of providing for the ~~appointment-by-the-Governor~~ election of a chairman of the Advisory Council on Prevailing Wage Rates by a majority vote of the Council; and specifying the term and eligibility for ~~reappointment~~ election of the chairman of the Advisory Council on Prevailing Wage Rates.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

Article 21 - Procurement
Section 8-513(d)
Annotated Code of Maryland
(1981 Replacement Volume and 1982 Supplement)
