Senate Bill No. 466

AN ACT concerning

Blind and Deaf Individuals - Rights - Penalties for Violations

FOR the purpose of ~~providing that any person who violates certain provisions relating to the rights of blind individuals is civilly liable to the injured party for certain damages; altering a certain penalty for certain violaters persons convicted of a certain misdemeanor; violating certain rights of certain handicapped individuals requiring that the court shall order certain persons to pay attorney's fees under certain circumstances; and providing that certain acts by certain blind, visually handicapped, or deaf individuals shall not be held to constitute contributory negligence.~~

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

Article 30 - Deaf, Mute or Blind  
Section 33(d)(3) and (g)  
Annotated Code of Maryland  
(1976 Replacement Volume and 1982 Supplement)
