AN ACT concerning

Blind and Deaf Individuals - Rights - Penalties for Violations

FOR the purpose of providing-that-any-person-who-violates-certain provisions-relating-to-the-rights-of-blind-individuals-is eivilty-liable-to-the-injured-party-for-certain-damages; altering a certain penalty for certain violators persons convicted of a-certain-misdemeanor; violating certain rights of certain handicapped individuals requiring-that-the-court shall-order-certain-persons-to-pay-attorney's-fees-under certain-circumstances; and-providing-that-certain-acts-by certain-blind; -visually-handicapped; -or-deaf-individuals shall-not-be-held-to-constitute-contributory-negligence.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

Article 30 - Deaf, Mute or Blind Section 33(d)(3)-and (g) Annotated Code of Maryland (1976 Replacement Volume and 1982 Supplement)
