Dear Mr. President:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 506.

This bill provides that if an individual refuses to take a chemical test for alcohol, a sworn report will be sent to the Motor Vehicles Administration by the police officer within 72 hours after detention of the individual.

House Bill 830, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 24, 1983, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 506.
