Administration after certain individuals are detained and refuse to take a certain chemical test for alcohol.

AN ACT concerning

Insurance - Group Health Insurance

FOR the purpose of providing a conversion privilege to persons whose coverage under a group health insurance policy is terminated; exempting certain types of policies from the
