W<sup>e</sup>re the refors comand you that by good lawfull men of your  
baigwith you make knowne & give warning to the said Justician  
Gerard that he be & appear before us in our Court of Chancery the  
eighteenth day of this instant June wherefore it shall be holden  
to shew cause if any he hath why the said Letters Patent for the  
said land so surreptitiously obtained ought not to be revoked &  
aduised & made void upon Record & the same into our hands be  
seized, & to do & receive what our said Court shall consider of in  
this behalfe And in what manner you execute this p<sup>t</sup>ent you  
make known unto us the day aforesaid & have you thereto this  
writt written your seales at the city of St. Maryes the seventeenth  
day of June in the third year of our Dominion of Anno Domini  
1678.

At which said eighteenth day of June in the year  
aforesaid the same Sheriffe with the returne of the p<sup>t</sup>ent  
aforesaid endorsed, that by vertue therof he had made &  
known unto Justician Gerard before Henry Bonner and  
John Heard good lawfull men of his baigwith that he  
should make his personall appearance here att the day and  
place aforesaid, as by the said p<sup>t</sup>ent he was commanded Whereupon  
the said Justician Gerard being solemnly called appeared by  
Moloniak Blakiston his Attorney and whereupon Recd  
Chesdyne Esq<sup>r</sup> his Lord<sup>r</sup>s Attorney Gen<sup>r</sup> & on the behalfe of his  
Lord<sup>r</sup>s offered himselfe against the said Justician Gerard and  
desirous that the Patent aforesaid for the reasons aforesaid should  
be aduised vacated & made void and the said Justician Gerard  
by his attorney aforesaid nothing in barre thereof alledge<sup>r</sup> but the said Patent so surreptitiously obtained as aforesaid to this  
Court delivered & surrendered Whereupon after due & mature  
consideracon had & taken of upon the premises and the said  
Patent & Certificate of Resurvey being duly pondered considered  
this Court doe order adjudge & decree the said Patent & all and  
singular the entries therof to be null & void to all intent &  
purposes whatsoever And that the same Patent be immediatly  
vacated in open Court by the Hon<sup>r</sup>ble Philip Calvert Esq<sup>r</sup>  
Chanceller of this Province, & that the entries therof be  
vacated upon Record and the same lands into his Lord<sup>r</sup>s  
hands to be seized Which said Patent was in open Court by the  
said Chanceller cauited & made void according to the order and  
decree aforesaid ~
