

Of the Defend^t being openly read & heard, & upon hearing & debating thereupon by this Court seriously viewed and considered & hearing what could be alleged on either side this Court was all clearly satisfied that the bill of three thousand Eight hundred pounds of tobacco in the bill of Complaint mentioned bearing date the twenty seventh day of January anno uno thousand six hundred seventy six ought to be delivered up to the Comp^t Edward Williams cancelled & made void And that the Defend^t pay unto the Comp^t of six of June in the third year of the Dominion of Charles the Annos said one thousand six hundred seventy eight ordered & decreed by this Court, that the said bill of three thousand Eight hundred pounds of tobacco be delivered up by the said Bruen Radford to the said Edward Williams cancelled and made void And that the said Bruen Radford pay unto the said Edward Williams the sume of two thousand two hundred seventy six pounds of tobacco for his costs in this behalf laid out & expended.
