Justice shall appertaine and from your sentence and decree  
therein we will that there shall be noe appeals But that your sent-  
=ence and decree therein shall be final, w<sup>ch</sup> wee hereby Comend  
you to publish by the tenth day of November next ensuing  
& wee doe hereby Authorise and appoint Charles Boteler Gentle-  
to be Register of the said Court who is hereby Comended, your  
proceedings therein to transmitt into our Deare Cousin William
