

Item. Was the said John Doory at the time when he delivered the instructions concerning a Will in sound mind perfect memory did he not Read and Reckon & calculate & consider Ex parte words before or during the time that he was giving the said instructions what intemperative words or expressions did he use at the time of giving the said Instructions touching the Truth herein.

Item. Did John Doory at the first giving of the said instructions order Mr. Nicholas Paynter to put downe Elizanor Dooryes sonne Owen Quigley to his Executors without mentioning John Quigley to be an Executor. How caused the said John Quigley to be afterwards named as an Executor was it not by intemperancy and perswasion of some person or persons there present and who was it that soe perswased him and what arguments or words were used to that purpose and what answer did the said John Doory make to the same declare the truth herein.

Item. Did not the said John Doory declare his intent that John Quigley should be overseer of his will declare the Truth.

The same day came Edmond Dernott before this Court in obedience to a Citation to him by this Court Directed to

His Examination of Edmond Dernott before the Court of Delegates to the foregoing Interrogatories as followeth

Edmond Dernott aged twenty six yeards of thredabouys from upon the Holy Evangelists.

1 To the first interrogatory saith that he did know John Doory and had known him somme or elsewhen yeards of thredabouys that he dyed about the forond of December 1677 that he was not a servant to the said Doory at the time of his death but that he lived in the house with him.

2 To the second Interrogatory that your depon. did personate by John Doorys or discours that he had a mind to make his Will and that he told this deponent so much that he desired this deponent to send for one to make his Will your deponent asked who he would haue sent for Bloomfield or Paynter and his said Doory answered thos that wold wort to haue whichever your deponent sent to him for paynter which Mr. Paynter came to Dernott turned all persons out of the Room only himself and aforesaid your deponent asked Mr. Doory whether he haue Paynter or no and Doory said yes I know him very well I am not so ill as you take me to be John Doory desired Mr. Paynter to write his Will and he quarellled altho had to Elizabeth Doory and Owen Quigley and after a small stoppe put in his sonen Quigley or Capt. John Quigley your deponent knows not whether that John Doory was of a sound memory to the best of your deponents knowledge and spake the words sayde enough when he gaue that direction for making his Will.

3 To the third Interrogatory he saith that as to the form of words in express he shewed him the said Will but that he lost all his estate to Edmon Doory, Owen Quigley & John Quigley & that he ordered his daughter to nominate y^e aforesaid persons to be Execut^{ors} that his daughter what in Doorys presence when he wrote the Will about two of the clock in the afternoon and Doory dyed about seven or eight of the clock the same night That your deponent made oath to the paynter shewde this before y^e Goudnow
