

Item. Was the said John Doory at the time when he delivered the instructions concerning a Will in sound and perfect mind & memory did he not say and speak several words and extravagant words before or during the time that he was giving the said instructions what interrogatory words or expressions did he use at the time of giving the said Instructions to declare the Truth herein.

Item. Did John Doory at the first giving of the said instructions order M^r. Nicholas Paynter to put down Ellenor Doory and Owen Quigley to be his Executors without mentioning John Quigley to be an Executor. How came the said John Quigley to be afterwards named as an Executor was it not by importunity and persuasions of some person or persons there present and who was it that so persuaded him and what arguments or words were used to that purpose and what answer did the said John Doory make to the said Declared the Truth herein.

Item. Did not the said John Doory declare his intent that John Quigley should be overseer of his will declare the Truth.

The same day came Edmond Dornott before this Court in obedience to a Citation to him by this Court Directed.

The Examination of Edmond Dornott before the Court of Delegates to the foregoing Interrogatory as follows

Edmond Dornott aged Twenty six years of the County of Down upon the Holy Evangelists.

- 1 To the first interrogatory saith that he did know John Doory and had known him Ten or Eleven years of the County that he dyed about the second of December 1677 that he was not a servant to the said Doory at the time of his death but that he lived in the house with him.
- 2 To the second Interrogatory that your Depont. did perceive by John Doorys discourse that he had a mind to make his Will and that he told this Depont. for much that he desired this Depont. to send for one to make his Will your Depont. at that who he would have sent for Bloomfield or Paynter and the said Doory answered those that were next to hand who upon your Depont. sent to Guilmeant for Paynter when M^r. Paynter came up. Depont. Turned all persons out of the Room only the said and afterwards your Depont. asked M^r. Doory whether he knew Paynter or no and Doory said yes I know him very well I am not for I'll let you take me to bed. John Doory desired M^r. Paynter to write his Will and bequeathed all he had to Ellenor Doory and Owen Quigley and after a small stopp put in his favor Quigley or Capt. John Quigley your Depont. knows not which that John Doory was of a sound memory to the best of your Deponts knowledge and spoke the words played enough when he gave that direction for making his Will.
- 3 To the third Interrogatory he saith that as to the form of words in the paper showed him he cannot depose but that he saw all his estate to Ellenor Doory Owen Quigley & John Quigley & that he ordered Paynter to nominate y^e aforesaid persons to be Executors that Paynter what in Doorys Chamber when he wrote the Will about two of the clock in the afternoon and Doory dyed about seven or eight of the clock the same night that your Depont. made oath to the paper showed him before y^e Governour
