

4. To the fourth Interrogatory he cannot depose.  
 The Examination of Edmund Dormitt to the Cross interrogatory  
 = forgoe, forgoing.

That your Dependent was present to John Doory upon the day  
 of his death and with him when he dyed and for two or three months  
 before that Doory desired your dependent would send for one to make  
 his will. but that no person moved it to him that the said Doory gave  
 instructions to Nicholas Paynter to draw his will and that he ordered his whole  
 Estate to Edmund Doory and Owen Quigley and after some space to  
 John Quigley that the said instructions were immediately put in  
 writing but that no draught of a will was ever read to the  
 Doory in his life time that the said Doory when he gave instructions  
 for his said will was of a sound and perfect mind but that a  
 little after your dependent asked him the said Doory who should be one  
 of his said will and the said Doory answered stay a little and  
 he will tell you but presently thereupon the said Doory fell into a fit  
 whereof he dyed that the said Doory at the first giving instructions  
 to Nicholas Paynter did name Edmund Doory and Owen Quigley  
 to be his Executors and a little after named John Quigley but was not  
 persuaded by any person soe to doe as your dependent saith  
 = forgoe But did not name John Quigley to be Overseer of his  
 Will.

The Examination of Nicholas Paynter to the interrogatory  
 a foregoing before the Court of Delegates being sworn upon the Holy  
 Evangelists the 26<sup>th</sup> day of October 1678.

1 To the first interrogatory saith that the paper showed him  
 was the will of John Doory and that your dependent proved the  
 same before the Governour that your dependent did know John Doory  
 and had known him about three years that the said Doory dyed  
 the 10<sup>th</sup> day of December that your dependent did not know the  
 house to which he was his servant.

2 To the second he cannot depose.

3 To the third saith that the paper showed him was drawn according to the  
 substance of Doorys instructions and that that paper is the same your  
 dependent would not Doorys remember the day before Doory dyed and that  
 your dependent swore to the same before the Governour.

4 To the fourth he saith one Sunday about noone of the said day being  
 the second of December 1677 your dependent was called by Richard Dalton  
 from Williams house to speake with the said Dalton and by the way  
 your dependent asked Dalton what the business was, who told this dependent  
 that the business was to make Doorys will and that Doory was then of  
 sound memory to the best of your Dependents judgement.

The Examination of Nicholas Paynter to the Cross interrogatory  
 = forgoe a foregoing being sworn upon the Holy Evangelists before the Court of  
 Delegates the 26<sup>th</sup> day of October 1678.

1 To the first saith that Dalton came to this dependent and told your depen-  
 dent that Doory sent for him this day to make the said Doorys will  
 or words to that effect and when your Dependent came into Doorys Chamber  
 where the Lay Jests Doorys face was towards the wall and Dormitt
