

Robert Dwyer Esq. the said Comptroller positively affirmed it was not, and did say
 the said Defendant but to take it up and sell it in his own name and assign
 but his right and title to the said Comptroller it would be sufficient for him that the said
 would not trouble himself about the title of the said Land or the Comptroller thereof
 that the said Comptroller would run the hazard of all other persons or persons as
 lay any right or title to the said Land, which the said Comptroller said he could not
 take up himself. Because he was not naturalized being a Dutchman Comptroller
 and thereupon the said Defendant did at the solicitation of the said Comptroller and in order to
 do him a kindness procured the said Land to be sold and sold in
 his said Defendant's own name and did in pursuance of an agreement between
 the said Comptroller and Defendant by a writing under their hands bearing date the
 twentieth day of February One thousand six hundred and seventy One for the
 consideration therein expressed bargain and sell assign and give over all his
 Right Title and interest to the said parcel of Land, with a Clause of reserving
 therein upon the non payment of six thousand pounds of tobacco to the
 Defendant or his assigns And the said Defendant further saith that the said Land
 was at the Comptroller's request sold in the said Defendant's name and that he during
 that time told the said Comptroller that he the said Land had a good right and title to the said
 Land and would make the said Comptroller a good estate of the same, or that the said Defendant
 did ever persuade the said Comptroller to buy the said Land and that the said Defendant did take
 the said Land up at the said Comptroller's request and was by agreement what he sold to
 sell the said Land to the said Comptroller as aforesaid And that the said Comptroller did that he sold the
 said Land to the said Comptroller for six thousand pounds of tobacco And that the said Comptroller being
 indebted to the said Defendant in Eleven hundred sixty seven pounds of tobacco more
 passed bill to the said Defendant for Seven thousand One hundred sixty seven pounds of tobacco
 And that the said Comptroller not paying according to his bill put the said Land in suit And
 the said Comptroller being then not able to pay the said Seven thousand One hundred sixty
 seven pounds of tobacco did in purchasing the said Land to forbear him a little longer
 the said Defendant was put out upon his promise to make good pay the next year and to
 pay the said bill of suits which came to four hundred seventy five pounds of tobacco
 to satisfy the said bill And that thereupon the said Defendant did further with by his bill
 bearing date the Eighteenth day of October in the year of our Lord God One thousand
 six hundred seventy and three be and bound to the said Defendant in six thousand seven hundred
 six hundred forty two pounds of tobacco And that the said Comptroller hath paid thereof to the
 said Defendant three thousand five hundred and sixty seven pounds of tobacco two more And
 the said Defendant further saith that the said Comptroller did persuade him to sell for him the
 said Comptroller the said Land which was formerly taken up and was agreed to be sold
 to the said Comptroller as aforesaid And that was only intended by the writing aforesaid
 that the said Defendant should only sell all his Right and Title to the said Land and
 premises with warranty only against the said Defendant and his heirs and assigns
 by form or under him And that the said Defendant did never pretend that he had sufficient
 right to sell the said Land And that he never pretended that the said Land belonged to the
 said Defendant, or that the said Defendant ever agreed at any time to do so the said Comptroller
 ever meddled with the said Land if not at the said Comptroller's request And Comptroller saith that the
 Comptroller in or about the Month of December last then said six hundred seventy six
 sent to the said Defendant's house at Blythe and told him that if he would take One thousand
 six hundred pounds of tobacco in full satisfaction of the said bill he would pay
