 side this Court was all clearly satisfied that the said John Henry doth
 in his life time & doth & ought the said Henry's Grange with severall
 quantities of goods & divers sums of money and doth therefore think
 fit & so ord. adjudge & decree that the said Henry's Grange do forthwith
 pay unto the said John Halloway & Ann his wife & Co. of the aforesaid
 Grange the sum of Twenty & four pounds lawful money of England together
 with Three thousand three hundred fifty five pounds of Tobacco & of
 Suit taxed by that Court & do so therefor hereby & with charge &
 Commands you the said Henry's Grange at all over the say^{ed} matters &
 things in the said final Judgment or do soe mannered specified &
 contained so far forth as the same or any of them do in any way
 touch or concern you you do well & truly observe & perform & fulfill
 & obey to all intents & purposes according to the tenor & true meaning
 thereof And that you pay unto the Com^{ts} or their Assigns the said
 sum of Twenty & four pounds of Lawfull money of England
 together with Three thousand three hundred fifty five pounds of Tobacco &
 of Suit And that you are in no wise to omit & to personally to be sworn
 on the 4th day of our said City of St. Mary's the tenth day of
 December in the fourth year of our Dominion over our said
 Province Anno q^{ue} Edw^{ardi} 4^{to} Anno 1564 the six hundred Seventy Eight.
